1. April 13 - Vaisakhi
2. April 22 - Earth Day:- It is a day meant for taking serious action for the preservation and conservation of nature. Make Earth day an every day affair.

4. May 1 - Worker's Day (International Labour Day):- It is observed to honour the social and economical achievements of working men and women. First time it was observed in Madras on May 1,1923 by Labour Kisan Party of Hindustan

6. May 8 - World Red Cross Day - Jean Henri Dunant, known as the father of Red Cross, was born on this day. Since the inception of Red cross, volunteers have been doing commendable job between the crisis and crisis management.

14. August 6 - HIROSHIMA DAY : It is observed in many parts of world with special vigils and peace marches. It is held to commemorate the dropping of the first atomic Bomb on HIROSHIMA on 6th August 1945.

15. August 15 - Independence Day. India attained freedom from the BRITISH RULE, on this day. Every year August 15 is celebrated as Independence Day in India.

17. September 5 - Teacher' Day. It is held on September 5 of every year, which is also the birthday of Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, one of our former Presidents. He was an ideal teacher.

35. December 1 - World AIDS Day - World Aids Day observed on December 1 every year, is dedicated to raising awareness of the AIDS pandemic caused by the spread of HIV Infection. It is an opportunity for people

world wide to unite in the flight against HIV.

36. December 3 - World Disability Day :It holds Immense significance for the disability sector. It brings the needs, concerns and rights of persons with disability into the national limelight.
37. December 7- Armed Forces Flag - In the course of achieving victory in various wars the nation has fought, armed forces have lost valuable lives. Keeping this in view the Armed Forces Flag Days is observed on december 7 every year.
38. December 10 - Human Rights Day. The universal Declaration of Humans Rights was adopted on 10th December 1948. The date has since served to mark HUMAN Rights Day world wide.

40. January 12- National Youth day - It is celebrated In honour of Swami Vivekanand, whose birth day falls on 12th January. It was felt that his Philosophy and ideals for which he lived would be a source of Inspiration of Indian youths.
